Malte Bramstång is a young goalkeeper who already shows a solid technical base and several qualities that stand out for his age group. He demonstrates good positional awareness, particularly when facing diagonal shots, consistently setting his angles well and reacting quickly to low finishes. His reflexes on shots along the ground are a clear strength, allowing him to deal effectively with close-range situations and rebounds. Despite not being among the tallest goalkeepers of his generation, his elasticity and coordination enable him to reach higher shots when required, compensating for his physical profile.

With the ball at his feet, Malte appears comfortable and composed, especially in situations where the team is under pressure. He is capable of playing short, grounded passes to help maintain possession and relieve pressure, acting as a reliable outlet rather than opting for rushed clearances. Although playing out from the back is not the team's main build-up method, he shows confidence when involved and does not hesitate to participate. Defensively, he also shows bravery in using his feet to block or save shots from very close range, demonstrating quick reactions and good decision-making in tight spaces.

From a tactical perspective, Malte displays a growing understanding of his role within the defensive structure. In situations involving long balls played behind the defensive line, he still shows some hesitation in stepping out of his goal, which reflects a developing level of confidence rather than a lack of physical ability. This is typical for a goalkeeper at U16/17/19 level and represents an area for future refinement. In contrast, during defensive set pieces, he shows greater assurance, confidently coming off his line to challenge attackers and attempting to secure the ball, indicating a developing sense of control within his penalty area.

Physically, Malte is a quick and agile goalkeeper with strong reactions and good short-distance acceleration. His reflexes are well above average for his age, particularly in situations where shots are taken quickly or from close proximity. While height is not currently his main physical asset, his mobility, coordination, and explosiveness allow him to remain effective in a variety of save situations. As he continues to mature physically, these attributes provide a strong foundation for further development.

Mentally, Malte stands out for his communication and leadership tendencies. He frequently instructs teammates regarding positioning and specific game situations, showing an understanding of the

organisational responsibilities of the goalkeeper role. He remains focused and engaged throughout matches, does not shy away from decisive moments, and shows a proactive attitude in directing the defensive line. These leadership traits are particularly valuable at his age and suggest qualities that can be further developed over time.

Overall, Malte Bramstång presents a profile of a reliable and promising young goalkeeper. He combines good positioning, strong reflexes, comfort with the ball at his feet, and emerging leadership qualities. While there is room for growth in confidence when dealing with long balls behind the defence, his current skill set and mentality indicate interesting long-term potential. With appropriate coaching that emphasises decision-making, communication, and leadership, he has the attributes to continue progressing into a well-rounded goalkeeper profile as his career develops. If Malte continues to progress by maximising his strengths, particularly positioning, reflexes, communication, and decision-making, his potential places him comfortably within the level of the Swedish 4th division (Division 2) or the Finnish 3rd division in the near future. With appropriate coaching and competitive exposure, these levels represent a logical and attainable next step in his development.
